GRADUATION, RETENTION, AND TRANSFER RATES

The Federal Student Right to Know Act requires that graduation rates be published to aid students in their decision making process in choosing to attend college. Information is based on a data sample of entering students. Below, graduation (within 150 percent of the normal time), retention (fall to fall), and transfer to another college institution (following fall) rates from the annual publication of the North Carolina Community College Critical Success Factors are reported. The NCCCS standard is that 60 percent of the fall cohort will graduate, be retained, or have transferred to another institution.¹

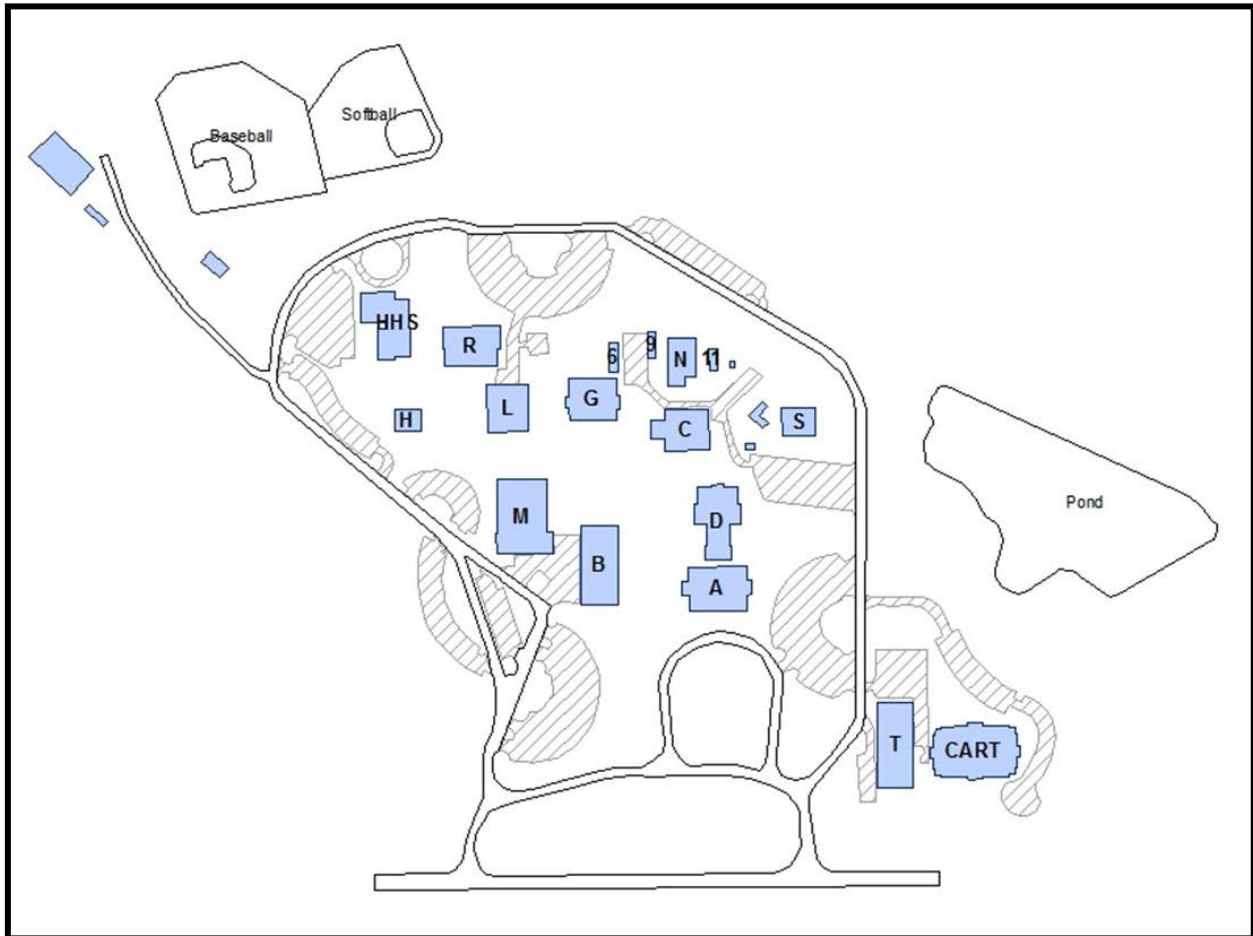
