### Technical Standards for: Criminal Studies

The following are standards which a student in the Criminal Studies majors will be required to perform in order to successfully complete the program. #### **Requirements:**

##### **Critical Thinking**

- Ability to gather relevant information, interpret data, recognize problems, and use a process to make informed, independent decisions that show good judgment.

##### **Interpersonal Skills**

- Ability to communicate effectively with other students, faculty, staff, and professionals.
- Ability to function and contribute as a member of a team.
- Ability to listen to others and respond appropriately in sometimes stressful environments.

##### **Cognitive Skills**

- Ability to use logic and reasoning.
- Possess short-term and long-term memory skills.
- Ability to process and respond to written and verbal instructions.

##### **Communication Skills**

- Possess ability to write and speak in standard English.
- Ability to comprehend written and spoken words.
- Ability to communicate information and ideas so that others will understand, both one-on-one and in group settings.
- Ability to effectively communicate while considering the viewpoints of others in the learning environment.

##### **Mobility**

- Ability to perform physical activities that include manual dexterity.
- Ability to tolerate wearing personal protective equipment.

##### **Physical Demands/Motor Skills**

- Must have ability to function in various weather conditions.

Technical Standards for: Criminal Studies

**Auditory Ability**

- Possess auditory acuity to hear voices and various sounds in one's environment.

**Visual Skills**

- Possess visual acuity, color vision, depth perception, and peripheral vision.
- Ability to conduct visual surveillance for extended periods of time.
- Ability to conduct visual searches and investigations of people, vehicles, buildings, and large outdoor areas.
